

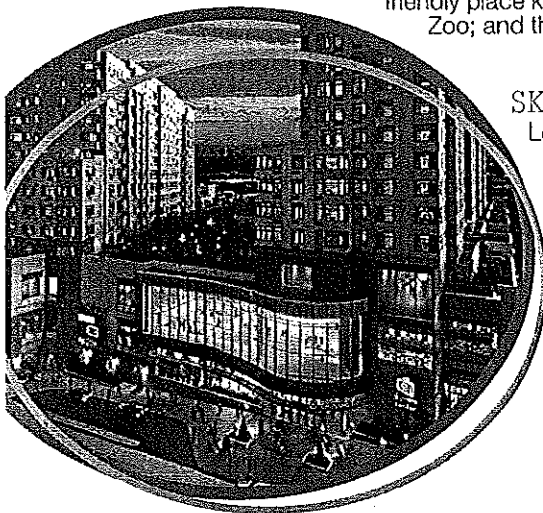
# Things TO DO IN flushing

New York's borough of Queens, located across the East River from Midtown Manhattan, has become a top cultural destination. Step outside our doors and into the most ethnically diverse 115 sq. miles on earth and explore all the things to do in Flushing. The 7 subway line, dubbed the International Express, has even been designated a part of the National Millennium Trail for its representation of the immigrant experience.

Downtown Flushing is the largest urban center in Queens, and home to the second largest Chinatown in New York City. Flushing Meadow-Corona Park's 1,255 acres was the site of two World's Fairs (1939 and 1964), and visitors need look no further than the great steel Unisphere to recall that era of history. Just beyond our hotel, you will find the new Citi Field Stadium, home of the New York Mets and the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center, which hosts the U.S. Open Tennis Tournament each year in August. Less than two miles away is the New York Hall of Science, a kid-friendly place known for its interactive, hands-on exhibits; the Queens Museum of Art; the Queens Zoo; and the Queens Botanical Garden.

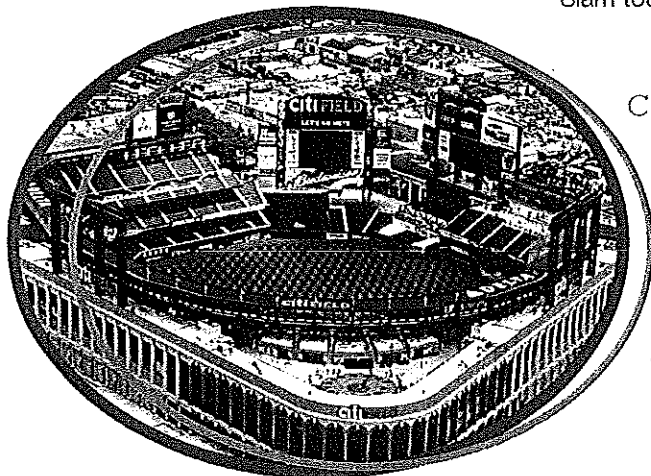
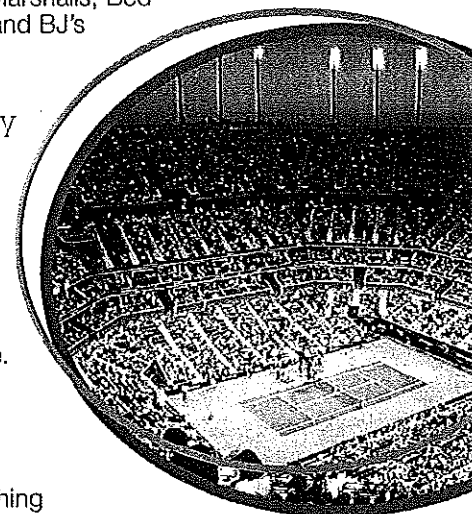


## SKYVIEW CENTER MALL - 0.2 MILES

Located in downtown Flushing, Queens, just two blocks from the MTA #7 subway, The Shops at SkyView Center is the regions' largest mixed-use, multi level shopping destination offering a growing mix of premier national retail stores for women's, men's and children's apparel, shoes, electronics, home furnishings, entertainment, cosmetics, groceries and more. Tenants include leading value brands such as Target, Marshalls, Bed Bath & Beyond, Best Buy, Old Navy, Carter's and BJ's Wholesale Club.

## Arthur Ashe Stadium (Formerly US Tennis Center) - 0.3 miles

Arthur Ashe Stadium, a part of the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center located within Flushing Meadows-Corona Park in the New York City borough of Queens, is the main tennis stadium of the US Open, the last of each year's four Grand Slam tournaments, and also where the annual Arthur Ashe Kids' Day takes place.

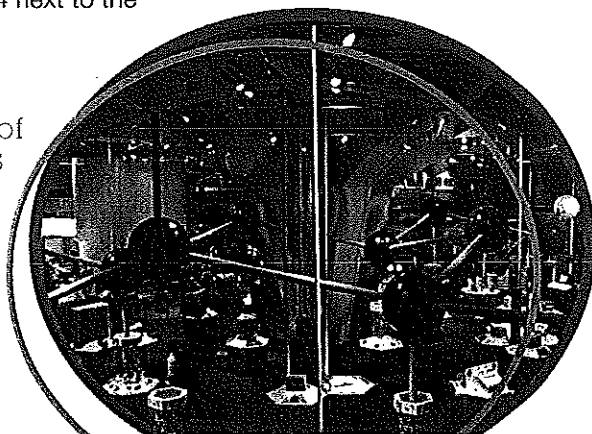


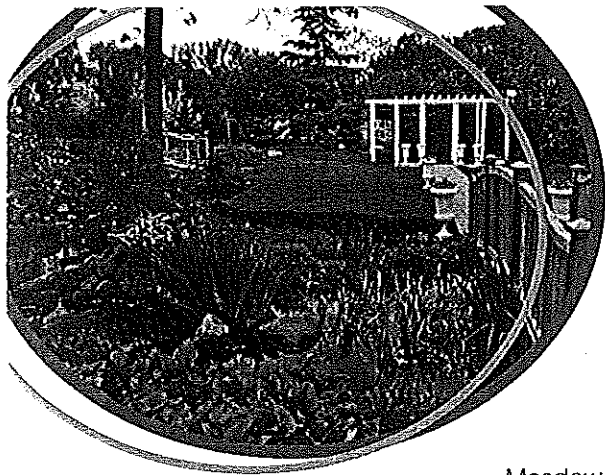
## Citi Field (Home of New York Mets) - 0.3 miles

Citi Field is a stadium located in Flushing Meadows-Corona Park in the New York City borough of Queens. Completed in 2009, it is the home baseball park of Major League Baseball's New York Mets. Citi Field was built as a replacement for the adjacent Shea Stadium, which opened in 1964 next to the site of the 1964-1965 World's Fair.

## New York Hall of Science - 2 miles

The New York Hall of Science occupies one of the few remaining structures of the 1964 New York World's Fair in Flushing Meadow-Corona Park in the borough of Queens in New York City. Today, it stands as New York City's only hands-on science and technology center. The more than 400 hands-on exhibits explore biology, chemistry, and physics.



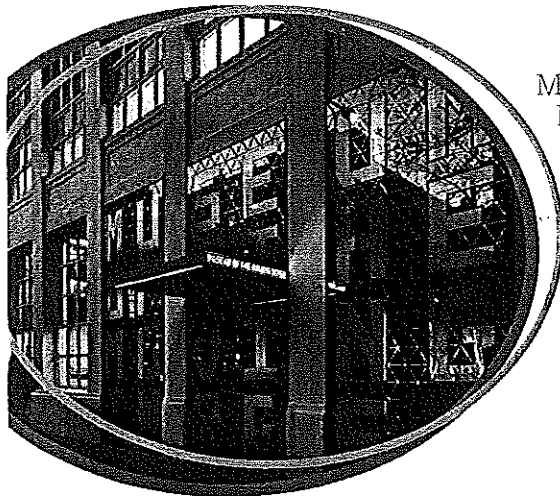


**Queens Botanical Garden - 2 miles**

The Queens Botanical Garden now consists of 39 acres of rose, bee, herb, and perennial gardens. It is an urban oasis where people, plants and cultures are celebrated through inspiring gardens, innovative educational programs and demonstrations of environmental stewardship.

**Flushing Meadow-Corona Park - 3 miles**

Often referred to as Flushing Meadow Park, Flushing Meadows Park or Flushing Meadows, is a public park in New York City. It contains the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center, the current venue for the U.S. Open tennis tournament; Citi Field, the home of the New York Mets baseball team; the New York Hall of Science, the Queens Museum of Art, the Queens Theatre in the Park, the Queens Wildlife Center, and the New York State Pavilion.

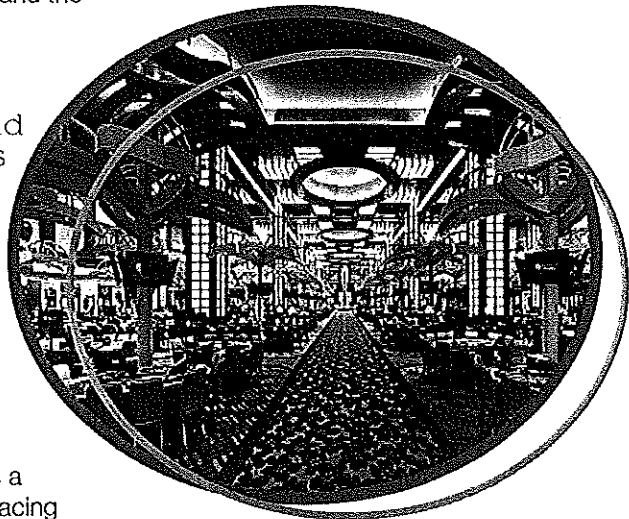


**Museum of the Moving Image - 5 miles**

Museum of the Moving Image advances the public understanding and appreciation of the art, history, technique, and technology of film, television, and digital media. It does so by collecting, preserving, and providing access to moving-image related artifacts, screening significant films and other moving-image works, presenting exhibitions of artifacts, artworks, and interactive experiences, and offering educational and interpretive programs to students, teachers, and the general public.

**Aqueduct Race Tracks - 12 miles**

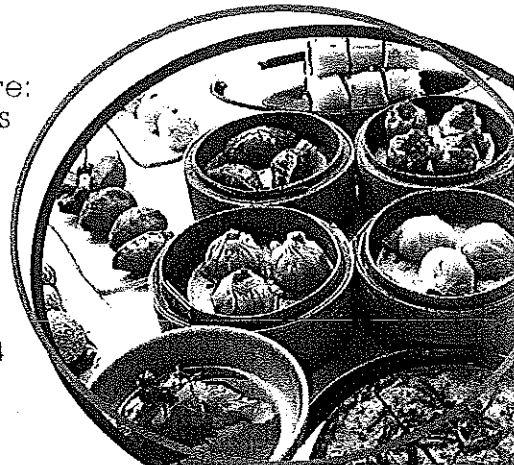
